

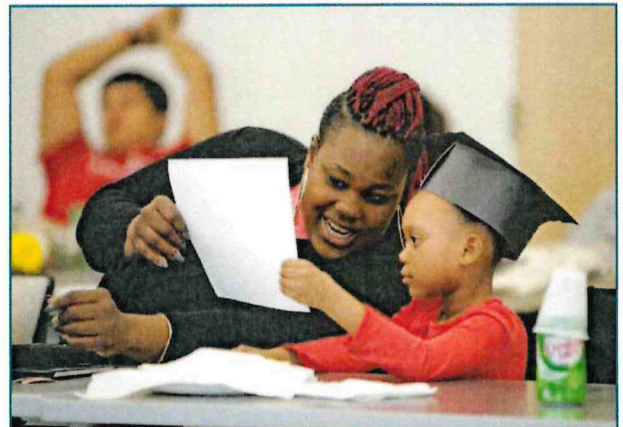

A recent study by the University of Massachusetts Donahue Institute and Way Finders projects a shortage of 19,000 affordable rental units in the Pioneer Valley by the end of 2025. Every new development, every new home, and every person empowered by these resources represents a step closer to a more equitable, thriving region for all.

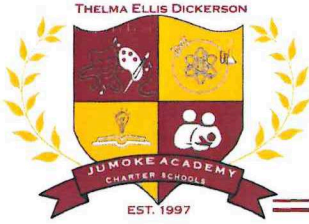

On behalf of the Tech Foundry team and those whom we serve, I am writing to express our gratitude for the Liberty Bank Foundation's generous grant award of \$7,500 paid via check, received 10/8/2024.

Liberty Bank Foundation's ongoing, leadership-level support has been critical to our overall operations and increasing positive impact of our work on those who study, live, work and run businesses in the Commonwealth.

In this, our 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary year, we are celebrating ten years of innovation and impact. As we look ahead to the next decade, we're reflecting on what the organization has accomplished since its founding in 2014 with the support of our community of partners and generous funders like the Foundation. Specifically, in the past ten years, Tech Foundry has:

- Served over 470 individuals through more than 20 cohorts of student-members of our IT Support Training Program.
- Increased tech sector diversity, with 60% of student-members self-identifying as BIPOC and the majority residing in one of the Gateway Cities of Western Massachusetts.
- Helped lift individuals and their families out of poverty. The average annual income of students before training is less than \$25,000, with a significant percentage being below \$15,000. Tech Foundry alums increase their annual income by 40-60% in their first tech job upon graduation.
- Graduated more than 70% of our student-members and placed 75% in tech roles.
- Opened the Tech Hub in Holyoke, allowing Tech Foundry student interns and alumni Digital Fellows to hone their skills while providing hands-on and free digital literacy training, IT help desk support, device distribution, and other services to our local community.
- Launched a robust student coaching program utilizing the nationally recognized EMPATH model.

Tech Foundry is a solutions-focused organization, which leverages pragmatic strategies in collaboration with employers, community-based organizations, and economic development entities to create measurable and sustained impact. With the Foundation's support, we are creating an equitable future where diverse individuals' potential and tech skills unlock opportunities and create thriving communities throughout our region.
